OVERVIEW

Project SHINE-OC provides Full Service Partnership (FSP) services to Vietnamese adults and older adults living with serious mental illnesses in Orange County. With a "whatever it takes" approach, the FSP implements innovative mental health services to assist participants on their path to recovery and wellness.

The program's ultimate goal is to provide holistically, culturally and linguistically responsive services to improve participants' overall health and enable them to integrate into the community.

WHO WE SERVE

Vietnamese adults 18 years and older in Orange County living with serious mental illnesses who are:

- Facing cultural and linguistic barriers
- Homeless or at risk of homelessness
- At risk of or have a history of hospitalization
- At risk of or have a history of incarceration
- Experiencing legal issues

SERVICES PROVIDED

- Therapy and psychiatric services
- Rehabilitation services
- Intensive case management
- Benefits acquisition
- Peer support
- Vocational and educational support
- 24/7 crisis response and intervention
- Co-occurring substance use support
- Basic needs support (housing, food, transportation, etc.)
- Care coordination with primary care providers
- Referral and linkage to community resources
